Dear Woodbury Heritage Society Members,

(Notes from interview with Earl Raths)

When the Raths family talks about "Hangin' the Green" they are not talking about decorating for St. Patrick's Day. For them, it is meeting at the Heritage House to decorate their ancestral home for the holiday season. The family gathers on the Saturday after Thanksgiving to festoon the house and grounds with garlands, boughs and wreaths.

Woodbury owes a large thank you to the family for making the corner of Radio Drive and Lake Road a very special spot during the holidays. It is like a real life Christmas card.

The tradition was started about eight years ago by Elmer Raths when he provided the funds for the decorations. Since then, over thirty descendants of Fredrick and Sophia Raths gather annually at the 1873 house to celebrate their roots. After the decorating chores have been completed the entire clan meets at Champps restaurant for a pre holiday dinner and to catch-up on the family gossip.
