
Woodbury Citizen's Academy History Presentation

The presentation, on February 27th, was again held at the Woodbury United Methodist Church. The 153-year-old chapel set the perfect stage for a journey through time via photos of Woodbury's history presented by Kathryn Ho, along with a fascinating presentation about the geography of Woodbury by Bill Schrankler. Wayne Schilling and Dick Bielenberg volunteered their time to share some of their recollections of days gone by, which clearly captivated the academy students. The students all went home with an old-fashioned toy they made, along with a much better appreciation for what makes Woodbury such a special place to live.

We will also be working on putting together a display with parts of the original Woodbury Post Office, and so would especially be interested in artifacts like early letters, envelopes, or anything related to early postal service in Woodbury. 




